Under the law, a tree can be cut down if "the property owner determines that the tree is damaged, diseased, pest infested, or presents a danger to others or property as a result of a tropical storm watch or warning tropical storm, hurricane watch or warning, hurricane, or declared state of emergency."

As a precaution, Orlando and Winter Park suspended their tree-removal permit process when the law took effect July 1.

Orlando spokeswoman Karyn Barber said in an email that the city isn't accepting applications for tree-removal permits on single-family residential properties.
