

Waste Pro Solid Waste Services

- Household garbage and recycling services resumed normal pick up schedule on Monday, 10/3/22.
- Bulk day will continue to be picked up on the 2nd pick up day of your regular scheduled service.
 - 3 bulk items may be placed at the right of way.

Please be patient as our crews are picking up increased volume of waste.

Yard Waste Pick Up

Please see the diagrams for Waste Pro yard pick up schedules.

- First phase will start with the area map in **BLUE** which represents the Tue/Fri routes. This section will be serviced on Wed 10/5 & Sat 10/8
- Second phase will start with the area map in **GREEN** which represents the Mon/Th routes. This section will be serviced on Wed 10/12 & Sat 10/15
- If yard waste is not picked up on the first two pick up dates, trucks will be back on the next scheduled pick up.

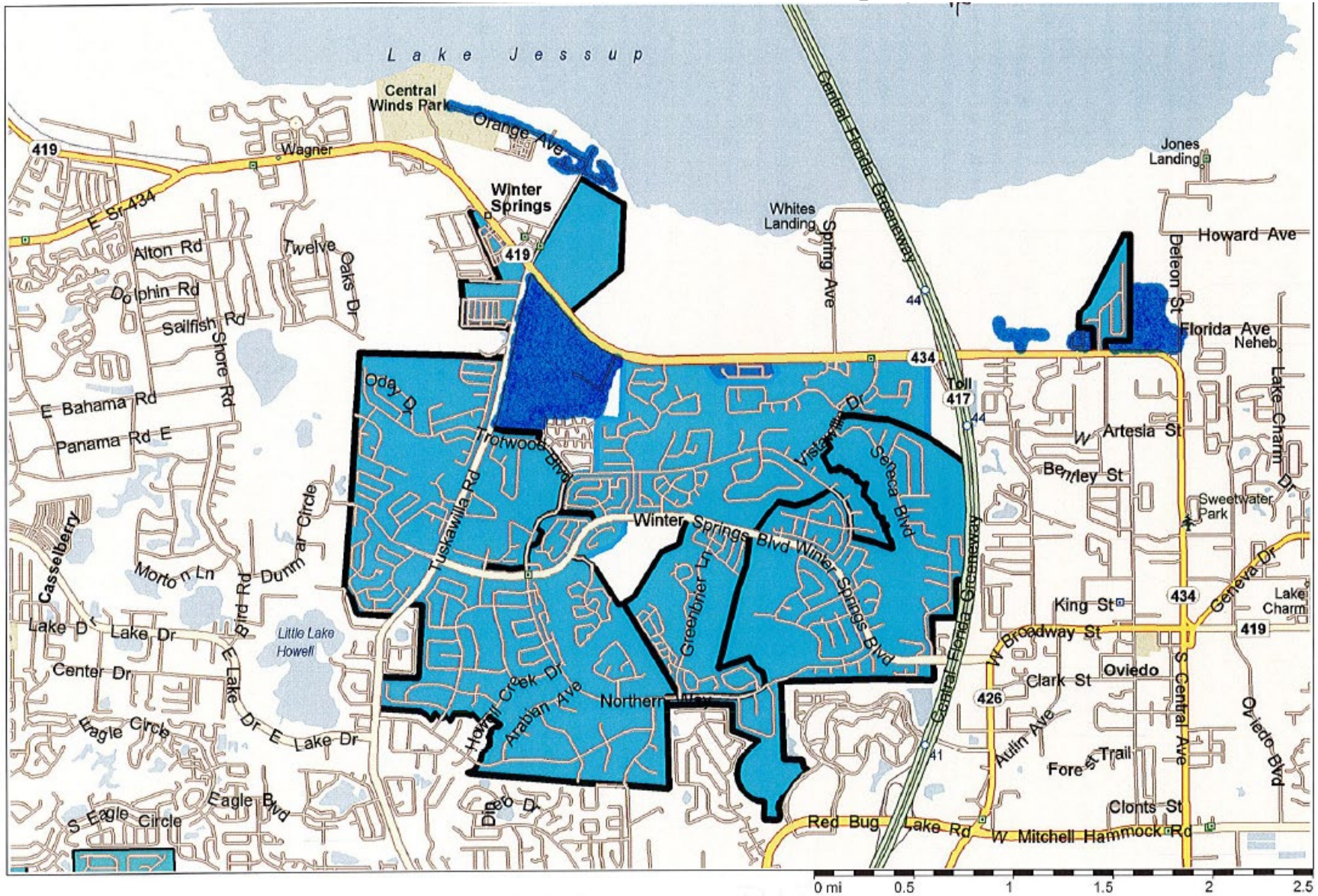
Yard waste guidelines:

- All debris should be placed on the right of way by 6am on your pick up date.
- Debris placed on the street or property will not be picked up.
- Small debris such as leaves should be placed in bags, bundles or containers not to exceed 50 pounds for containers or 25 pounds for bags.
- Leave materials that have not been picked up for next pick up. Do not re-container materials.

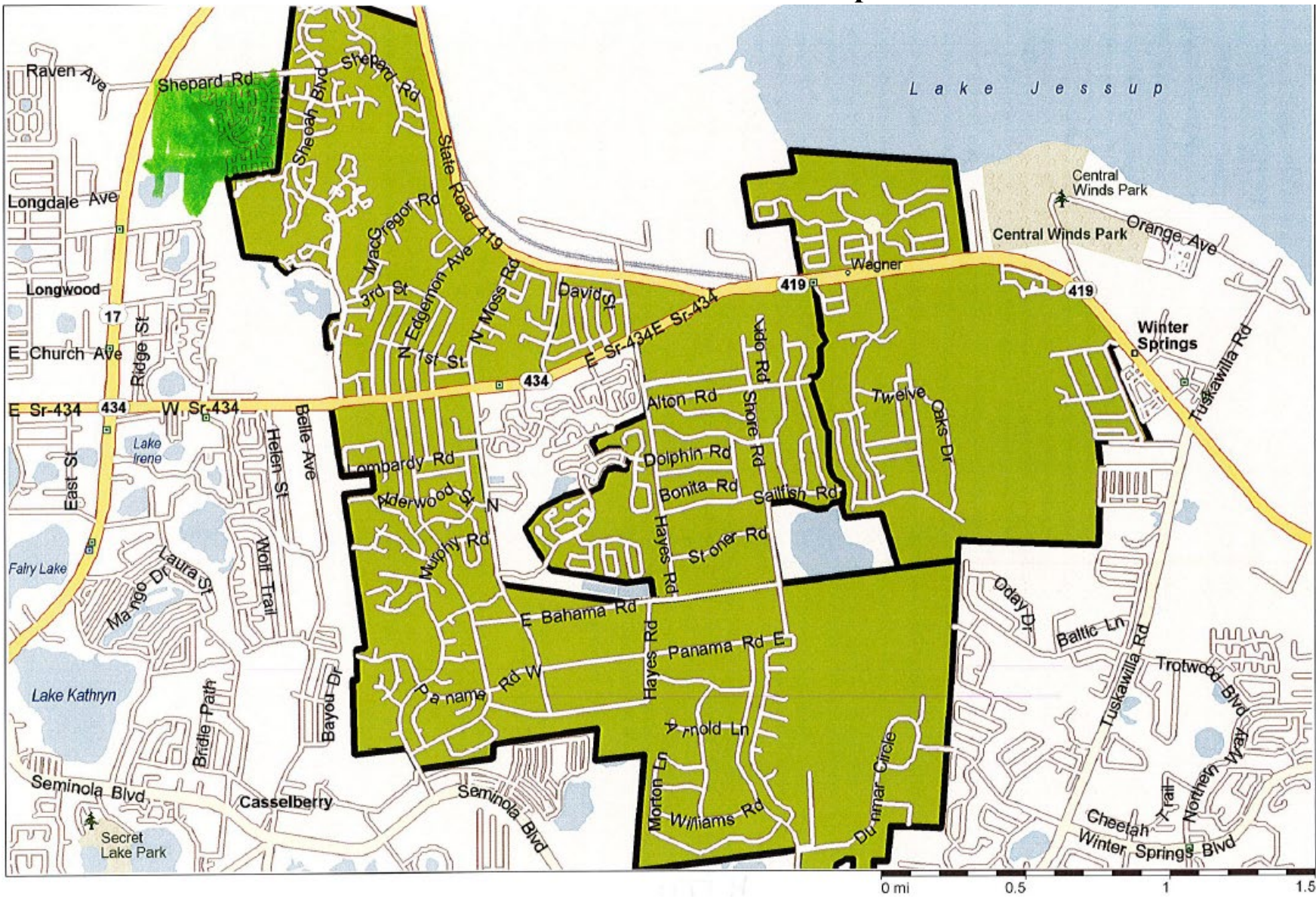
Debris Waste Haulers

- The City of Winter Springs has contracted debris pick up crews.
- Crews will rotate throughout the city in multiple passes. (see map on our website updates <https://www.winterspringsfl.org/community/page/debris-pickup>)
- If crews have not picked up at your address, rest assured they will return soon as they are picking up in passes.
- All debris must be placed on the right of way.
- Debris placed in the street, sidewalks or on property will not be picked up.
- Crews are not equipped to rake or gather small debris.
- Do not lean debris on poles or trees.
- Debris trucks will not pick up bagged items, house hold waste or recycling.

Debris Separation Tips

HAULING HURRICANE-RELATED DEBRIS TO THE CURB IN PARTICIPATING AREAS

Following these specific guidelines will make for a speedier removal process.

Check with your local government on what is available for you.

PICKING UP THE PIECES

Following these specific guidelines when hauling hurricane-related debris to the curb will make for a speedier removal process

WRONG WAY

CROSSING THE LINE
 ➤ Any debris placed from the sidewalk toward your property will not be picked up. Contractors cannot collect items on private property.

PROPPING UP
 ➤ Do not set debris against trees or poles. Doing so makes it harder for cleanup crews to scoop up the items.

HELPFUL HINTS

A Limit curbside garbage to two 32-gallon containers or eight trash bags

B Refrigerator and freezer doors must be secured with duct tape

1 HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE

- Bagged trash
- Discarded food
- Packaging, papers
- All garbage should be placed curbside the night before the scheduled weekly pickup.

2 CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

- Building materials
- Drywall
- Lumber
- Carpet
- Furniture
- Mattresses
- Plumbing

3 VEGETATION DEBRIS

- Tree branches
- Leaves
- Logs

4 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

- Oils
- Batteries
- Pesticides
- Paints
- Cleaning supplies
- Compressed gas

5 'WHITE' GOODS

- Refrigerators
- Washers, dryers
- Freezers
- Air conditioners
- Stoves
- Water heaters
- Dishwashers

6 ELECTRONIC

- Televisions
- Computers
- Radios
- Stereos
- DVD players
- Telephones
