
If you are traveling, be patient. The holiday can cause delays and traffic issues so please be a courteous and safe driver.

CITIZEN'S POLICE ACADEMY

The Winter Springs Police Department is hosting a Citizen's Police Academy starting October 5, 2021 through December 14, 2021. It will be on Tuesday nights from 6:00pm to 9pm and class is limited to 20 people.

Attendees will be given a brief overview of topics ranging from K9 operations to Code

Enforcement. Classes will be taught by WSPD officers who focus on each topic in their daily roles.

Applications can be downloaded from the City's webpage or picked up at the Winter Springs Police Department. Once completed return the application to the police department along with your photo ID. Applicants must agree to a full background check before acceptance. Applicants will be notified when they are accepted.


SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

- Scissors


Your donations can be dropped off in the school supply donation box in the lobby of the Police Department.
