STAY HEALTHY IN 2021

Cleaning and disinfecting are critical to staying healthy and avoiding germs! Frequently touched items and surfaces should be cleaned regularly. Here are some helpful tips from the CDC for routine cleaning and disinfecting:

- Wear reusable or disposable gloves for routine cleaning and disinfecting. Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds immediately after removing the gloves.
- Clean surfaces using soap and water first, then use disinfectant.
- Never mix household bleach with any other cleaners. This may release harmful vapors.
- For items that can be laundered, use the warmest appropriate water setting per the manufacturer's instructions and dry items completely.

GOLF CART COMMUNITY

Did you know that the City of Winter Springs is a golf cart friendly community?

These simple rules apply when operating a golf cart within our city limits:

- Citizens can use Golf carts on all streets within the City of Winter Springs, where the posted speed limit is 30 MPH or less.
- A Golf Cart is considered a motor vehicle designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course for recreational purposes as defined in section 316.003(68), Florida Statutes. It is a self-propelled vehicle with: a minimum of four (4) wheels; a maximum speed of less than 20 MPH; a maximum rated payload capacity of 1200 pounds; a maximum Gross Vehicle Weight of 2,500 pounds; it can transport up to four (4) persons; and which complies with the safety operations standards established in [City Ordinance Chapter 12](#).
- A valid driver's license issued by the State of Florida or any other State is required to operate a motor vehicle. Only persons over 16 years of age and holding a driver's license may operate a golf cart.
- You must have and maintain liability insurance coverage on a golf cart in the amount required by Florida law for vehicles operated on public roads in the State.
- The owner shall register golf carts through the city Code Enforcement Division. The owner pays an annual registration fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) and is issued a registration decal to affix to the golf cart. Decals are issued annually and valid for one year. A ten dollar (\$10.00) renewal fee is required and due every January.
- Additionally, an inspection is required by ordinance by Code Enforcement. We will cover the safety inspection and requirements on operating a golf cart on the roads in

the City of Winter Springs during your registration.

Stormwater Pollution



STORMWATER SAFETY

Protect our environment one step at a time with these storm drain safety tips!

1. **Never** dump anything in a storm drain or drainage ditch.
2. Clean up after your pets. Pet waste is a significant source of pathogens.
3. Throw litter in its proper place. If you see garbage near a storm drain, pick it up!
4. Never pour household hazardous waste into storm drains, down the sink, or on the ground. Household hazardous waste is accepted at the Seminole County Central Transfer Station **free of charge**.
5. Do not put greasy food items down the drain or garbage disposal. Remove excess grease with a paper towel before washing dishes.
6. Maintain your septic systems regularly.
7. Check vehicles for leaks regularly and repair as needed.
8. Compost yard wastes and use grass, leaves, and shrub clippings as mulch. Do not rake these materials into roadways or swales.
9. Motor oil is banned from landfill disposal and **cannot** be placed with your garbage. Recycle used motor oil and other car fluids at the oil recycling "igloos" found at most Seminole County Fire Stations. You may also take used motor oil to the Seminole County Central Transfer Station.
10. Only use fertilizers and pesticides when other methods fail and always follow labeled instructions. Do not apply them when rain is forecasted.
11. When you need to wash your car, it's best to take it to a carwash where all wastewater flows into a sanitary sewer system for treatment.
12. If you see any illegal dumping, **report it immediately**.
