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UPDATE: Work continues on City Of Winter Springs Reclaimed Water Main Extension project

The construction is part of a planned expansion of the City of Winter Springs reclaimed water system.

WINTER SPRINGS, Fla.- Work continues along State Road-434 in Winter Springs as crews expand the City's reclaimed water system.

Construction will now shift east along State Road 434 to the area between Michael Blake Boulevard and the Cross Seminole Trail pedestrian bridge.

The work will occur in the median Monday through Friday during daylight hours. If conditions permit, drivers may see minor impacts to traffic along SR-434 Saturday, April 15, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Crews continue to utilize construction techniques to preserve existing trees and shrubs along the median, even relocating trees elsewhere in the city when necessary.

The second phase of the project is part of a planned expansion of the City of Winter Springs reclaimed water system.

The construction will be completed in several phases and involves installing a 12-inch reclaimed water main along State Road 434 from Central Winds Drive to Creek Run Way.

Once complete, the new system will provide reclaimed water to the eastern parts of Winter Springs, ultimately reducing drinking water use for irrigation.

The project, funded with grants, city funds, and additional funds from the St. Johns River Water Management District, is expected to be completed in late 2023.
