City of Winter Springs Closures

All City of Winter Springs offices, City Hall, facilities, Police Department, and Parks will be closed from Wednesday, September 28, 2022, through Friday, September 30, 2022, in preparation for Hurricane Ian. Winter Springs Senior Center, Civic center, and Therapy pool will remain closed all week and will open on Monday, October 3, 2022.

On Wednesday, September 28, 2022, Regularly scheduled yard waste collection will take place. Place branches, tree limbs, clippings, palm fronds, etc., in a trash can, bag, or tie in a bundle. Bundles must not exceed 4 feet in length. There will be no regularly scheduled pick-up on Thursday. Friday collections will be determined as the storm passes through. Utility payments have been postponed.

Call 407-327-1000 to report non-emergency items to the Winter Springs Police Department. Always dial 911 for an emergency. Winter Springs Police Department will have more police on patrol throughout the week.

Call 407-327-2669 to report post-storm damage to us. This post-storm assistance line will be operational after the Hurricane to receive your reports about damage or utility issues that need attention. Use this number to report post-storm damage such as: Sewer Backups, Utility Service Interruptions, Street Flooding, Fallen Trees or Debris Blocking Roads. This number aims to clean up our city quickly and efficiently after any disaster.

Seminole County Office of Emergency Management will open shelters with ample time to evacuate. Emergency shelters should be used as a last resort. Two Shelters are located in Winter Springs. Winter Springs Highschool will serve as a general population shelter. Highlands Elementary School will serve as a medically enhanced shelter.
