

Winter Springs City Hall, offices, Senior Center, and facilities will be closed on Friday, March 29, 2024, in observance of the spring holiday


Normal business operations will resume on Monday, April 1, 2024, at 8 AM.

MARCH SAFETY TIP: LOCK IT OR LOSE IT

The Winter Springs Police Department is urging our community to join forces in combating auto burglaries by adhering to some straightforward yet crucial advice. One of the most effective strategies against vehicle thefts is simply locking your car doors and ensuring valuables are not left in plain sight.

By adopting this proactive approach, we can collectively deter thieves from targeting our neighborhoods and safeguard our property. Let's unite in our efforts to keep Winter Springs safe. Remember: Don't be a victim; prioritize your safety.

In the event you observe any suspicious activity, prompt reporting is essential. Contact the Winter Springs Police Department immediately by dialing 911. Provide detailed descriptions of individuals, including clothing and vehicle information such as color, make, and direction of travel. Every detail counts in aiding law enforcement.

WSPD AWARDED ACCREDITATION FROM **THE COMMISSION FOR FLORIDA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCREDITATION (CFA)**

The Winter Springs Police Department has once again received accreditation from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) following a rigorous, top-to-bottom review of agency policy and operations by a team of law enforcement practitioners around Florida.



To earn accreditation, an agency must comply with approximately 250 life, health, and safety standards.

After receiving initial accreditation in 2003, The Winter Springs Police Department has proven that it meets quality standards and has maintained a high level of service that our citizens have come to expect.

In an email to the department, Chief Matt Tracht thanked officers and staff for how well they represent the Winter Springs Police Department.

DRUG AMNESTY DROP BOX LOCATED IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT LOBBY

As part of our ongoing commitment to community safety and public health, we've installed a drug amnesty drop box in the lobby of the Police Department.

This Dropbox offers a convenient and anonymous way for you to dispose of any expired, unwanted, or unused medications, including pharmaceutical controlled substances. Whether it's leftover painkillers, expired prescriptions, or other medications, you can safely deposit them into the drop box, no questions asked.

Why is this initiative important? Improper disposal of medications poses significant risks to public health and safety. Flushing medications down the toilet or throwing them in the trash can lead to water contamination, accidental ingestion by children or pets, and misuse by individuals seeking drugs. By participating in Operation Medicine Cabinet, you're helping to prevent these potential hazards and contributing to a safer community for all.

The drop box is accessible 24 hours a day, seven days a week, so you can drop off medications at your convenience. Your actions make a difference in safeguarding our community and protecting our environment.
