

During the month of June 2016, the following were approved by the City of Winter Springs City Commission:

Ordinances:

 Ordinance 2016-02 – acceptance of the 2016 Districting Commission's recommendation for the revised City Commission district boundaries, reflecting the 2010 Census and new development projects between 2013 and the present

Resolutions:

Resolution 2016-11 proposing the conditional vacation of a portion of a ten-foot (10') utility easement on property located on the site of the recently approved Vistawilla Assisted Living Facility (ALF); of which the Final Engineering Plans were approved by the City Commission at the February 22, 2016 meeting.



DOH-SEMINOLE AND SEMINOLE COUNTY MOSQUITO CONTROL TELLS MOSQUITOES TO "BUZZ" OFF DURING MOSQUITO CONTROL AWARENESS WEEK

Sanford, Fla. – The week of Sunday, June 26 to Friday, July 1, 2016 has been declared the 20th Annual "National Mosquito Control Awareness Week" by the <u>American Mosquito Control Association (AMCA)</u>. The AMCA, an international organization of nearly 2,000 public health professionals, has been dedicated to preserving the public's health and well-being through safe, environmentally sound mosquito control programs since 1935.

"Over the last few years, the U.S. has had increased cases of mosquito-borne illnesses such as the West Nile Virus. Furthermore, other exotic diseases such as Zika Virus, Dengue fever and Chikungunya threaten our shores," said Dr. Swannie Jett, Health Officer for the Florida Department of Health in Seminole County (DOH-Seminole).

In observance of National Mosquito Control Awareness Week and in preparation for the 4th of July Holiday, DOH-Seminole encourages residents and visitors to follow a few simple tips.

1. Mow the lawn. Mosquitoes enjoy the plant nectar found in tall grasses and around shrubs. The air is also cooler in these spots. Cut your lawn and trim trees and shrubs to keep out these uninvited guests.

2. Eliminate standing water. One of the best ways to prevent a mosquito infestation is by removing the places they like to breed--water being the biggest one. This means:

- Empty items such as sandboxes, plastic toys, plant saucers, and abandoned buckets.
- Change water weekly in wading pools and bird baths.
- Drain standing water from canoes/kayaks and boat covers.
- Keep outdoor pet bowls clean and fill with fresh water on a regular basis.

3. Cover your skin. If you must be outside when mosquitoes are active, cover up. Wear shoes, socks, long pants and long sleeves. Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with 10-30% DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

4. Cover doors and windows with screens. Keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches and patios.

"To ensure the safety of family, friends and pets, it's extremely important to make sure you're taking the proper steps: first, reducing mosquito breeding by draining containers around your home, and second, protect yourself with use of repellents," said Gloria Eby, Director for Seminole County's Mosquito Control Program.

Beware of Contractor Fraud

The 2016 Storm Season is in full bloom. We would all like to think that we can make it through the season without any damage to our property. But in the event our summer storms do result in property damage, the Winter Springs Police Department (WSPD) would like to remind everyone not to fall victim to fraudulent contractors. Contractor Fraud becomes rampant in the wake of a big storm, with fraudsters preying on those in need. In the rush to get our roof fixed or other damages repaired, the added high-pressure tactics of a fraudster may make it easier to be talked into doing something we would not normally do. When hiring a contractor in general, there are several things to keep in mind. If we take these steps each time we hire a contractor, it can prevent undue damage to your home, save money and time, ensure the repair is done correctly and to code, and even prevent fraudulent contractors from wanting to work in our area.

- 1. ALWAYS HIRE A LICENSED, INSURED CONTRACTOR. Go to the Florida Department of State Licensing website and verify that the person with whom you are dealing is a licensed contractor and that they are licensed in the area of work they are performing on your home.
- DO NOT PAY MONEY UP-FRONT. Often, fraudsters look to get a large portion of their fee upfront. They will use excuses like needing it for materials and such. Up-front payments are a red flag to fraud.
- 3. VERIFY THE LEGITIMACY OF THE CONTRACTOR. The Better Business Bureau website will show any complaints and/or compliments accompanying the contractor. The City of Winter Springs can also verify if the contractor has pulled a permit for work at your home. The Police Department can also verify if a permit has been pulled or even if it is required. If a permit is required but the contractor has begun work without pulling the permit you may be at risk for fraud. A good online search to do is with www.sunbiz.org. Here you can search the name of the company or individual to see if they have filed with the Florida Department of State. If they haven't, the next question should be "why haven't they?".

Contractor fraud is a Felony and is punishable by more than one year in prison and by more than \$1,000 in fines. Fraudsters often sidestep the criminal charges by manipulating the home owner. Educate yourselves prior to hiring contractors for your residence. If the residence has been damaged by weather, immediately consult with your home owner's insurance company. They often will have approved contractors for the repairs you need. Your home owner's policy may also have stipulations regarding the repairs to your home as well as your mortgage lender. Education is always the key to avoid being defrauded. If you are in doubt and have questions, please do not hesitate to contact the Winter Springs Police Department. Have a safe, hurricane-free summer!

Back to School!

WSPD would like to welcome all of our students back to school. We would also like to remind parents that the first few days of school always cause a little more traffic congestion than normal. So, as a friendly reminder, make sure you get an early start. If you don't normally drive your child to school, expect delays during drop-off and pick-up. As drivers, let us all use extra care and caution as many of our elementary students walk to school. And as always, be a safe and courteous driver. A little patience and understanding goes a long way when traffic is heavy and the temperatures are high.

Citizen's Police Academy

Have you ever been interested in an in-depth look at our Police Department? Have an interest in being a volunteer Citizen on Patrol (COP)? It all begins with our Citizen's Police Academy. Beginning Tuesday, September 13th, you'll have a chance. The Citizen's Police Academy runs for 13 weeks, every Tuesday from 6:30PM – 8:30PM in the Emergency Operations Center of the Winter Springs Police Department. You will experience a wide variety of law enforcement-related education from traffic enforcement to processing a felony crime scene. <u>Attendees need to submit their applications by September 1st, 2016.</u> If the minimum number of applicants is not met, the Academy will be re-scheduled. Active Projects



Cross Seminole Trail:

• The Cross Seminole Trail has a missing link from Layer Elementary to the west end of Old Sanford/Oviedo Road. The planned connection will continue from the current terminus at Layer and run northerly adjacent to SR 419. Negotiations with the State are ongoing.

Magnolia Park Amphitheater:

• The Magnolia Park Amphitheater is proposed to be constructed at the eastern end of Blumberg Boulevard. Construction is anticipated to begin in fall 2016 with completion expected in early 2017.



Assisted Living Facilty:

• The City is working with the Hawthorne Group for a proposed assisted living facility. The facility will consist of 144 units with congregate dining and entertainment options. Engineered plans are scheduled to be submitted early in the third quarter of 2016.





Plante Property (Tuskawilla Crossing):

• The proposed project will include approximately 381 residential units comprised of traditional single family detached homes and detached bungalow units on lots ranging from 34 feet to 70 feet in width. In addition, the project will include a commercial component. Staff is working with the applicant on final modifications to the site design. Staff is currently working with the applicant to finalize the master plan.

ICI/Integra 360:

• Upon completion, the project will be a 39.81 acre Mixed Use development constructed in two phases which will consist of ten (10) acres of commerical/office uses containing a minimum of 100,000 square feet of commercial/office space, and approximately 29.81 acres of multi-family residential development consisting of a maximum of 340 apartment units and 20, two (2) story carriage units. The City Commission approved the Preliminary and Final engineering plan as well as aesthetic review and plat on June 13, 2016







CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)

Opportunity Site:

• Winter Springs offers excellent opportunities for the development of high technology industries. Situated on the eastern edge of the City, Seminole Way is a strategic economic development initiative focused on attracting high value jobs and businesses to Seminole County. The State Road 417 (Central Florida Greeneway) corridor defines the boundaries of the Seminole Way district, spanning the length of Seminole County and connecting to both Orange County's "Innovation Way" and the "Medical City" located at Lake Nona. The City has targeted the district for technology industry development complemented by commercial and retail establishments. This district is expected to become a premier employment center with professional and high tech office buildings, conference facilities, and hotel rooms. This opportunity site is comprised of 26 potential sites with over 378 acres. One of the key features of this opportunity site is the ease of assemblage: it offers the largest potential for consolidation of vacant developable land within the City under the ownership of only three land owners.

Seven Oaks Subdivision:

 The project consists of 138 single-family units located on the south side of Shepard Road, north of Florida Avenue, east of Boat Lake, near the City's boundary on U.S. 17-92. Approximately 125 of units the 138 have been constructed permitted. or

Southern Oaks Subdivision:

•TheSouthern Oaks subdivision consists of a 50-acre development, with approximately 92 houses near the Oviedo and Winter Springs boundary along SR 434. Staff anticipate the scheduling of a pre-construction meeting in the near future.

Vistawilla Assisted Living Facility:

• On February 22, 2016, the City Commission approved the Preliminary/Final Engineering Plan and Aesthetic Review for a 77,207 square foot Assisted Living Facility, located on the south side of SR 434. west of the SR 434/SR 417 interchange, and adjacent to the eastern side of the Vistawilla office building. Building plans been submitted. have А construction date is scheduled for the beginning of Fall 2016.
