Not all mosquitoes are the same. Different mosquitoes spread different diseases and bite at different times of the day. Some mosquito species bite during the day, such as those mosquitoes that can spread chikungunya, dengue and Zika viruses. Other species of mosquitoes bite most often at dawn and dusk, including those that can transmit West Nile virus.

Mosquitoes can live indoors and will bite at any time, day or night.



Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellents

Wear repellent when you are outdoors. Use products with active ingredients that are safe and effective.

- ■Always follow the product label instructions.
- ■Do not spray repellent on skin under clothing.
- If you use sunscreen, put sunscreen on first and insect repellent second.
- It is safe for pregnant or nursing women to use EPA-approved repellants if applied according to package label instructions.

- Read product information to find out how long the permethrin will last.
- ■Do not use permethrin products directly on skin.






Stop mosquitoes from breeding



As little as one teaspoon or bottle cap of water standing for more than one week is enough for mosquitoes to breed and multiply.



Put away items that are outside and not being used because they could hold standing water.



In your garden:

Keep flower pots and saucers free of standing water. Some plants, such as bromeliads, hold water in their leaves—flush out water-holding plants with your hose once a week.





Around all buildings:

At least once a week, empty, turn over or cover anything that could hold water:

tires

buckets toys

pools & pool covers birdbaths

trash, trash containers and recycling bins

roof gutters

coolers pet dishes

MAY IS WATER SAFETY MONTH

Living in Florida we all know that there are two seasons; hot and not-so-hot! More importantly, as the temperature rises so does activity in and around the water. The Winter Springs Police Department would like to remind everyone that even though we look forward to a summer around the pool or at the beach, there are some inherent dangers that come with our attempts to stay cool. Keep these rules in mind to keep your summer safe and refreshing.

- 1. NEVER LEAVE A CHILD UNATTENDED AROUND A POOL, SPA, BATH TUB OR BODY OF WATER.
- 2. Teach your children basic water safety skills.
- 3. Learn how to swim and ensure your children know how to swim as well.
- 4. Have a phone close by when visiting pool, spa or the beach.
- 5. If a child is missing, look for them in the pool or spa first, including neighbor's pools or spas.

6. Share safety instructions with family, friends, babysitters and neighbors.

If you have a pool:

- 1. Install a 4-foot fence around the perimeter of the pool or spa, including portable pools.
- 2. Use self-closing and self-latching gates; ask neighbors to do the same if they have pools or spas.
- 3. If your house serves as the fourth side of a fence around a pool, install and use a door or pool alarm.
- 4. Maintain pool and spa covers in good working order.
- 5. Ensure any pool or spa you use has a compliant drain cover; ask if you do not know.
- 6. Have life saving equipment such as life rings, floats or a reaching pole available and easily accessible.

Some of us will take to the water in boats and personal water craft, canoes and kayaks. Make sure you have been properly trained in their usage and what to do in case of emergency.

1. Make sure you vessle conforms to US Coast Guard safety standards and that all US Coast Guard required safety equipment is aboard and in use. (If you are unsure, please visit http://www.uscqboating.org/)

- 2. Do not consume alcohol or drugs while operating a boat, personal water craft, kayak or canoe.
- 3. Know the limitations of your vessel.
- 4. Ensure all occupants know what to do in case of emergency.
- 5. Closely monitor weather and water conditions.

CITY OF WINTER SPRINGS CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS UPDATE



Active Projects



Cross Seminole Trail:

• The Cross Seminole Trail has a missing link from Layer Elementary to the west end of Old Sanford/Oviedo Road. The planned connection will continue from the current terminus at Layer and run northerly adjacent to SR 419. Negotiations with the State are ongoing.

Magnolia Park Amphitheater:

• The Magnolia Park Amphitheater is proposed to be constructed at the eastern end of Blumberg Boulevard. Construction is anticipated to begin in fall 2016 with completion expected in early 2017.



Assisted Living Facilty:

• The City is working with the Hawthorne Group for a proposed assisted living facility. The facility will consist of 144 units with congregate dining and entertainment options. Engineered plans are scheduled to be submitted in the second quarter of 2016.







The Greens at Tuscawilla:

• The 60 unit townhome project is located on Winter Springs Boulevard adjacent to the Tuscawilla Country Club. The project has one building remaining to be built.



ICI/Integra 360:

• Upon completion, the project will be a 39.81 acre Mixed Use development constructed in two phases which will consist of ten (10) acres of commercial/office uses containing a minimum of 100,000 square feet of commercial/office space, and approximately 29.81 acres of multifamily residential development consisting of a maximum of 340 apartment units and 20, two (2) story carriage units. The City Commission will consider approval of the Preliminary/Final Engineering Plan and Aesthetic Review for the first phase which consists of 340 apartment units and 20, two (2) story carriage units on 29.81 acres in the near future.











Opportunity Site:

• Winter Springs offers excellent opportunities for the development of high technology industries. Situated on the eastern edge of the City, Seminole Way is a strategic economic development initiative focused on attracting high value jobs and businesses to Seminole County. The State Road 417 (Central Florida Greeneway) corridor defines the boundaries of the Seminole Way district, spanning the length of Seminole County and connecting to both Orange County's "Innovation Way" and the "Medical City" located at Lake Nona. The City has targeted the district for technology industry development complemented by commercial and retail establishments. This district is expected to become a premier employment center with professional and high tech office buildings, conference facilities, and hotel rooms. The GID opportunity site is comprised of 26 potential sites with over 378 acres. One of the key features of this opportunity site is the ease of assemblage: it offers the largest potential for consolidation of vacant developable land within the City under the ownership of only three land owners.

Jesup's Landing:

• The project consists of 171 townhomes in 30 buildings on 17 acres of land located on the south side of Orange Avenue, behind Winter Springs High School. Construction is ongoing and the project is scheduled to be completed at year's end.



Plante Property (Tuskawilla Crossing):

• The proposed project will include approximately 381 residential units comprised of traditional single family detached homes and detached bungalow units on lots ranging from 34 feet to 70 feet in width. In addition, the project will include a commercial component. Staff is working with the applicant on final modifications to the site design. Staff is currently working with the applicant to finalize the master plan.





Pollack Shores Apartments:

• Final engineering plans were approved by the City Commission on December 14, 2015.





The RiZE at Winter Springs:

 This project is located east of City Hall in the Winter Springs Town Center. Occupancy of the first units began on March 15, 2016.





Seven Oaks Subdivision:

 The project consists of 138 single-family units located on the south side of Shepard Road, north of Florida Avenue, east of Boat Lake, near the City's boundary on U.S. 17-Approximately 113 the 138 units have been constructed permitted. or





Southern Oaks Subdivision:

• The Southern Oaks subdivision consists of a 50-acre development, with approximately 92 houses near the Oviedo and Winter Springs boundary along SR 434. The Development Agreement has been modified and will be presented to the City Commission in the near future.

Vistawilla Assisted Living Facility:

• On February 22, 2016, the City Commission approved the Preliminary/Final Engineering Plan and Aesthetic Review for a 77,207 square foot Assisted Living Facility, located on the south side of SR 434, west of the SR 434/SR 417 interchange, and adjacent to the eastern side of the Vistawilla office building. Building plans are anticipated to be submitted in June. A construction date has not been determined at this time.
