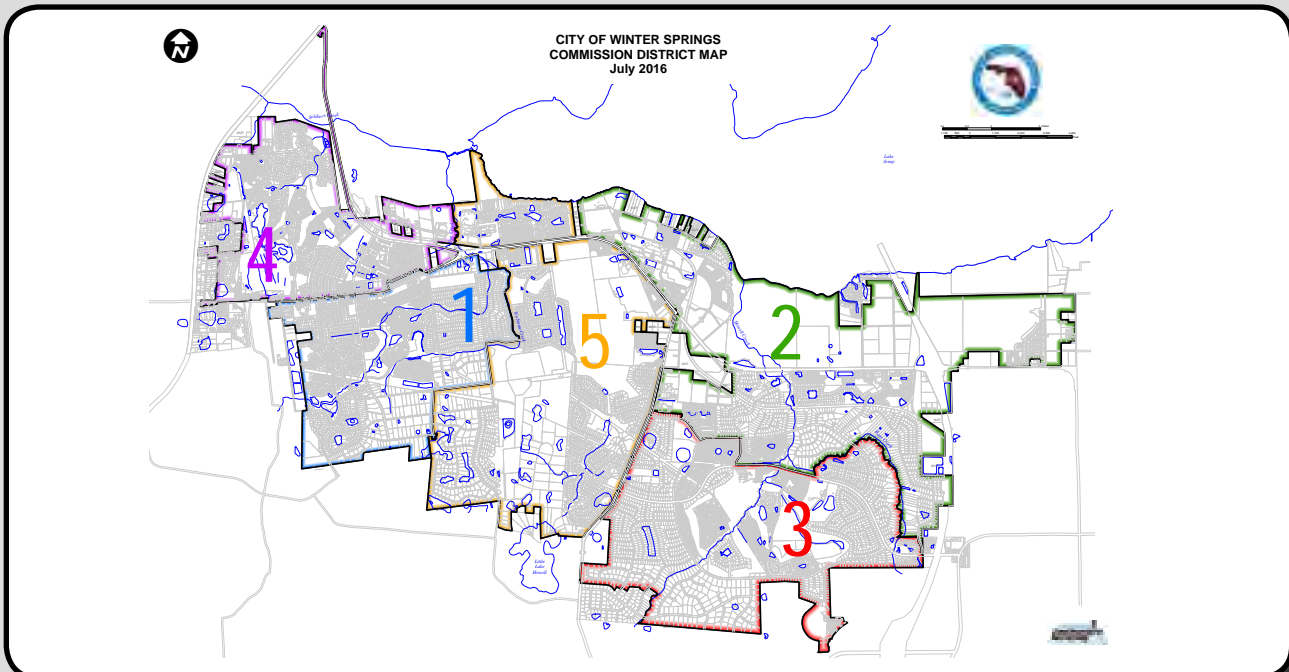

During the month of September 2016, the following were approved by the City of Winter Springs City Commission:

Resolutions:

- Resolution 2016-17 establishing the Final Operating Millage Rate at 2.4300 mills and the Final Voted Debt Service Millage Rate at 0.0700 mills for Fiscal Year 2017 for the City of Winter Springs. This represents a 0.0400 mills reduction in the total city millage rate over the prior fiscal year.
- Resolution 2016-18 establishing the Final Budget for the Fiscal Year commencing on October 1, 2016 and ending on September 30, 2017.
- Resolution 2016-20 accepting the proposal by Fifth Third Bank to purchase the City's Water and Sewer Revenue Refunding Notes, Series 2011 A, B & C, to refund all of the City's outstanding Water and Sewer Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2011 and authorizing the execution of the associated new loan agreement with Fifth Thirds Bank.

Contracts and Agreements:

- An agreement with Atlantic Civil Constructors Corporation for construction of Intersection Improvements at State Road 434 and Tuscora Drive (Right-Turn Deceleration Lane), ITB#06-16-BF.
- Approval to piggyback off of the Volusia County contract with Allied Universal Corporation for the purchase of Sodium Hypochlorite (liquid chlorine).
- An agreement with Universal Engineering Sciences for Building Inspections and Plans Review Continuing Services for an initial period of one (1) year with the potential of up to four (4) annual extensions by piggybacking off of Universal's contract with the City of Lakeland (RFQ # 4127).
- Traffic Signal Maintenance and Compensation Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation.
- Oviedo-Winter Springs Regional Chamber of Commerce Agreement for the 9th Annual Winter Springs Festival of the Arts.
- School Resource Officer (SRO) inter-agency agreement with the Seminole County School Board.
- Renewal of the contract with The Lake Doctors, Inc. for one year for aquatic weed control and maintenance services of City-maintained lakes, ponds, and other stormwater facilities

- Renewal of the annual Cisco Smartnet maintenance agreement thru Veytec, Inc., utilizing State of Florida Contract # 43220000-WSCA-14-ACS
- Preliminary/Final Engineering Plan and Aesthetic Review for Phase IV of the Nursery Road Warehouses, located on the south side of Nursery Road, east of U.S. 17-92, specifically at 1080 Nursery Road

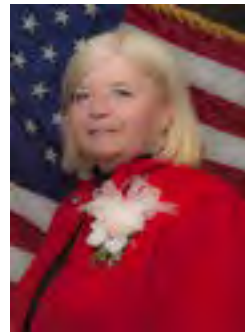

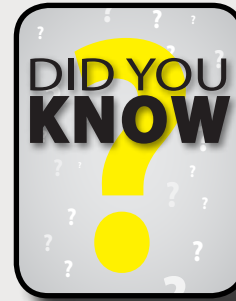

THE POLICE REPORT



Veteran's Day November 11th, 2016

Before we settle in for the Holidays, we would like to take this opportunity to thank all the Active Duty and Veteran personnel in our community. Your selfless service and sacrifice has provided the United States with an environment of freedom and prosperity that has become the envy of the entire world. This Veteran's Day, please take the time to remember and reflect on those who served and those who are still serving.

THE POLICE REPORT (CONTINUED)

Thanksgiving is quickly approaching. If you're going to deep fry that bird, here are some things to remember.

1. Hot oil may splash or spill during the cooking. Contact between hot oil and skin could result in serious injury.
2. A hot oil spill can happen with fryers designed for outdoor use using a stand. The fryer could tip over or collapse causing the hot oil to spill. Newer countertop units using a solid base appear to reduce this risk. NFPA does not believe the risks of either type of turkey fryer to be acceptable because of the large amount of hot oil involved and the speed and severity of burns.
3. In deep frying, oil is heated to temperatures of 350° Fahrenheit or more. Cooking oil is combustible. If it is heated above its cooking temperature, its vapors can ignite.
4. Propane-fired turkey fryers must be used outdoors. **They are very popular for Thanksgiving.** Many parts of the country may have rain or snow at this time of year. If rain or snow hits the hot cooking oil, the oil may splatter or turn to steam, leading to burns.
5. The Turkeys must be completely thawed before placing in the fryer because a partially thawed turkey can cause the hot oil to splatter and cause serious burns.
6. The fryers use a lot of oil, about five gallons. Considering the size and weight of the turkey, extreme caution must be taken when placing and removing the turkey from the fryer to be sure it is not dropped back into the fryer, splattering the oil on the chef.

NFPA urges those who prefer fried turkey to look for grocery stores, specialty food retailers, and restaurants that sell deep fried turkeys, or consider a new type of "oil-less" turkey fryer."

Black Friday Shopping

So you've decided to go shopping on Black Friday. Your sights are set on some real door-buster deals. If it's a day of shopping without which you cannot live, keep these things in mind:

1. Be patient and courteous. Beginning the season in a frenzy and causing or becoming the victim of injury is no way to start.
2. Be patient and courteous. So important, it's worth mentioning twice.
3. Don't leave packages in your vehicle for extended periods of time. If you take items home in between trips, you will deny criminals the opportunity to take them from your vehicle.
4. Don't go alone. You are always safer when you shop with a buddy.
5. Buy from reputable retailers who provide warranties and good customer support.

Always remember, if you see something unusual, do not hesitate to notify the Police. If you feel uncomfortable about calling the police department, you can report suspicious activity anonymously Crimeline at 1-800-423-TIPS or email an anonymous statement at www.crimeline.org.

WINTER SPRINGS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CITY OF WINTER SPRINGS CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS UPDATE



Active Projects



Cross Seminole Trail:

• The Cross Seminole Trail has a missing link from Layer Elementary to the west end of Old Sanford/Oviedo Road. The planned connection will continue from the current terminus at Layer and run northerly adjacent to SR 419. The property owner in the industrial park has tentatively agreed to donate the needed Trail right-of-way and the City is in the process of performing the surveys, environmental assessments and other due diligence needed to effectuate the land exchange with the State. The School Board is reviewing the easement needed to construct that portion of the Trail on school property from the current terminus to the SR 419 right-of-way. Approval by the Governor and Cabinet is targeted for 1st Quarter 2017 with construction commencing in summer 2017.

Magnolia Park Amphitheater:

• The Magnolia Park Amphitheater is proposed to be constructed at the eastern end of Blumberg Boulevard. Construction is anticipated to begin in spring 2017 with completion expected by the end of 2017.



Assisted Living Facility:

• The City is working with the Hawthorne Group for a proposed assisted living facility. The facility will consist of 144 units with congregate dining and entertainment options. Engineered plans are scheduled to be submitted in the fourth quarter of 2016.





CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)



Plante Property (Tuskawilla Crossings):

- The proposed project will include approximately 381 residential units comprised of traditional single family detached homes and detached bungalow units on lots ranging from 34 feet to 70 feet in width. In addition, the project will include a commercial component. Staff is working with the applicant on final modifications to the site design. Final Engineering Plans and Aesthetic Review have been submitted and are under staff review.

ICI/Integra 360:

- Upon completion, the project will be a 39.81 acre Mixed Use development constructed in two phases which will consist of ten (10) acres of commercial/office uses containing a minimum of 100,000 square feet of commercial/office space, and approximately 29.81 acres of multi-family residential development consisting of a maximum of 340 apartment units and 20, two (2) story carriage units. Site construction on the apartment phase of the project has commenced. Building plans are under review.





CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)



Opportunity Site:

- Winter Springs offers excellent opportunities for the development of high technology industries. Situated on the eastern edge of the City, Seminole Way is a strategic economic development initiative focused on attracting high value jobs and businesses to Seminole County. The State Road 417 (Central Florida Greenway) corridor defines the boundaries of the Seminole Way district, spanning the length of Seminole County and connecting to both Orange County's "Innovation Way" and the "Medical City" located at Lake Nona. The City has targeted the district for technology industry development complemented by commercial and retail establishments. This district is expected to become a premier employment center with professional and high tech office buildings, conference facilities, and hotel rooms. This opportunity site is comprised of 26 potential sites with over 378 acres. One of the key features of this opportunity site is the ease of assemblage: it offers the largest potential for consolidation of vacant developable land within the City under the ownership of only three land owners.

Town Center Update:

- The Winter Springs Town Center has been filling up with new sites. The RiZe, which is 83% leased, has helped bring new businesses to the Town Center. Recently two new restaurants have opened, Big City Pizza and Saigon Boulevard. Pet lovers can check out Pacino's Pet Pantry & Spa. Future tenants will include CareNow, a Tea Infusion Store, Martial Arts, and additional retail.



CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)



Seven Oaks Subdivision:

• The project consists of 138 single-family units located on the south side of Shepard Road, north of Florida Avenue, east of Boat Lake, near the City's boundary on U.S. 17-92. Project is nearing completion.



Southern Oaks Subdivision:

•The Southern Oaks subdivision consists of a 50-acre development, with approximately 92 houses near the Oviedo and Winter Springs boundary along SR 434. Staff anticipates the scheduling of a pre-construction meeting in the near future.



Vistawilla Assisted Living Facility:

• On February 22, 2016, the City Commission approved the Preliminary/Final Engineering Plan and Aesthetic Review for a 77,207 square foot Assisted Living Facility, located on the south side of SR 434, west of the SR 434/SR 417 interchange, and adjacent to the eastern side of the Vistawilla office building. Building plans have been submitted. A construction initiation date is scheduled for Fall 2016.

The milling and resurfacing contract has been awarded to The Middlesex Corporation. City Staff will provide paving notices to residents in the immediate vicinity of the resurfacing work approximately one week before work begins. No roads will be closed and residents will have access to and from their driveways at all times.

Project: Central Winds Park Roadway Improvements

Description: Roadway extensions of Central Winds Parkway and Orange Avenue into Central Winds Park, where they will intersect at a new roundabout. Project also includes sidewalks, additional parking, stormwater, and landscaping improvements.

Cost: \$1.4 million

Funding Source: Transportation Impact Fees

Status: Under construction, scheduled for completion in December 2016.

Project: Intersection Improvements at S.R. 434 and Tuscora Drive

Description: Construction of a right-turn deceleration lane on S.R. 434 eastbound at Tuscora Drive.

Cost: \$287,000

Funding Source: Transportation Impact Fees

Status: Construction contract has been awarded. Construction to start in November 2016 with estimated completion in January 2017.
