



Resolutions:


- Resolution 2016-12 indicating the City Commission's support for a Wayfinding Sign System Plan and adopts the criteria to be used for the signs



MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM



Protect Yourself From Mosquito Bites and Disease Eliminate Mosquito Breeding Areas Around Your Home

The Seminole County Mosquito Control Program is asking for your help to prevent the following diseases transmitted by mosquitoes:

Zika Virus (2016) * Chikungunya (2013) * Dengue Fever * West Nile Virus * Eastern Equine Encephalitis

You can help by eliminating standing water from any containers, and by protecting yourself and your family from mosquito bites. See below for more information.

Help Prevent Mosquito Diseases Drain and Cover

DRAIN standing water from any container where sprinkler or rainwater has collected. See the picture below to find places where water may collect around the outside of your home.

COVER your bare skin and clothing with repellent if you must be outside when mosquitoes are most active during the hours of dusk and dawn. Several disease-carrying mosquitoes are daytime biters and usually do not fly far from the containers where they spend their immature life stages. Wear shoes, socks, long pants, and long sleeves.

Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, Picaridin, Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective. Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months. Using repellents that are combined with sunscreen is not recommended. Apply sunscreen first, then apply repellent to make sure that each product works as intended.

Mosquito Facts & Biology

Did you know that mosquitoes must have water to develop, that only female mosquitoes bite (take a blood meal), and can live for several weeks and lay hundreds of eggs? Check out the mosquito life cycle below to learn more about these insects.

The Mosquito Life Cycle

1. Eggs are laid on water, on the side of containers, or on moist soil that may flood.

- 2. Larvae hatch from the eggs and live, feed, and grow in the water.
- 3. Larvae become pupae, then after 2 or 3 days adult mosquitoes emerge from the pupae.
- 4. Adult female mosquitoes fly off in search of a blood meal, lay eggs a few days later, and then the cycle begins again.

OTHER TIPS TO PREVENT MOSOUITOES

- Repair screening on windows, doors, porches & patios.
- Keep gutters clear so they will drain properly.
 - Check & empty:
 - Children's toys
 - Trash cans & lids
 - Untreated swimming pools
 Uncovered boats/watercrafts that are not draining water
- Change water in birdbaths & flush
- bromeliads once or twice a week.
- Do not allow water to accumulate in flower pots or dishes for more than 2 days.
- Check around faucets & air conditioner units, repair leaks & eliminate puddles that remain for several days.
- Fill tree holes & rotten tree stumps with spray foam insulation.
- Irrigate lawns & gardens carefully to prevent water from standing for several days.

THE POLICE REPORT



It's Back to School Time!

School is back in session and that means more homework. Even if we won't be returning to school, we as a community have a responsibility to maintain a high level of awareness and safety regarding the children traveling to and from school.

Kids

- 1. If you walk to school, use the sidewalks and cross with a crossing guard. Walk in a group with your friends and avoid walking alone. Be aware of vehicles and never ever get into a car with a stranger. Walk straight to school and go straight home.
- If you ride the bus, use your designated bus stop. While walking to the bus stop, use sidewalks and cross with crossing guards. Walk with your friends and while waiting for the bus, stay out of the roadway. Be respectful to the property at the location of your bus stop.
- 3. If you ride your bike to school, always wear a helmet. Use the sidewalks but be courteous of pedestrians. Avoid using the roadway, but if you must, know the rules of the road. When crossing the road, walk your bike across, never ride. If you have to ride in the winter when it may be darker in the morning, make sure your clothing is reflective or bright and light your bike accordingly.

Parents

- 1. Ensure your child walks the same route to school every day. Have them walk with other children so as to not be alone.
- 2. Help your child to get to the bus on time. When you must hurry, safety is sometimes forgotten.
- 3. If your child rides a bike to school make sure they wear their helmet, are visible to vehicles and know the rules of the road.

Drivers

- 1. Remember that with back to school there will be increased traffic on the roadway. Make sure to cater your schedule to accommodate the increase and ease your frustrations.
- 2. With the increased traffic there will also be increased children on or near the roadway. Please drive with caution in the presence of children.
- 3. Maintain a sense of vigilance in the presence of children. Many crimes against children have been interrupted or prevented due to vigilant citizens. If you see something, say something.

It is in the best interest of our community to take responsibility for our safety and the safety of our children. We at the Winter Springs Police Department want to provide our community with the right tools and information to prevent our citizens from being victimized from accident or crime. As we all do our part, we can ensure that Winter Springs remains one of the finest cities in Florida.

Active Projects



Cross Seminole Trail:

• The Cross Seminole Trail has a missing link from Layer Elementary to the west end of Old Sanford/Oviedo Road. The planned connection will continue from the current terminus at Layer and run northerly adjacent to SR 419. Negotiations with the State are ongoing.

Magnolia Park Amphitheater:

• The Magnolia Park Amphitheater is proposed to be constructed at the eastern end of Blumberg Boulevard. Construction is anticipated to begin in fall 2016 with completion expected in early 2017.



Assisted Living Facilty:

• The City is working with the Hawthorne Group for a proposed assisted living facility. The facility will consist of 144 units with congregate dining and entertainment options. Engineered plans are scheduled to be submitted early in the third quarter of 2016.





Plante Property (Tuskawilla Crossing):

• The proposed project will include approximately 381 residential units comprised of traditional single family detached homes and detached bungalow units on lots ranging from 34 feet to 70 feet in width. In addition, the project will include a commercial component. Staff is working with the applicant on final modifications to the site design. Staff is currently working with the applicant to finalize the master plan.

ICI/Integra 360:

• Upon completion, the project will be a 39.81 acre Mixed Use development constructed in two phases which will consist of ten (10) acres of commerical/office uses containing a minimum of 100,000 square feet of commercial/office space, and approximately 29.81 acres of multi-family residential development consisting of a maximum of 340 apartment units and 20, two (2) story carriage units. Site construction has started.







CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)

Opportunity Site:

• Winter Springs offers excellent opportunities for the development of high technology industries. Situated on the eastern edge of the City, Seminole Way is a strategic economic development initiative focused on attracting high value jobs and businesses to Seminole County. The State Road 417 (Central Florida Greeneway) corridor defines the boundaries of the Seminole Way district, spanning the length of Seminole County and connecting to both Orange County's "Innovation Way" and the "Medical City" located at Lake Nona. The City has targeted the district for technology industry development complemented by commercial and retail establishments. This district is expected to become a premier employment center with professional and high tech office buildings, conference facilities, and hotel rooms. This opportunity site is comprised of 26 potential sites with over 378 acres. One of the key features of this opportunity site is the ease of assemblage: it offers the largest potential for consolidation of vacant developable land within the City under the ownership of only three land owners.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE (Cont.)

Seven Oaks Subdivision:

• The project consists of 138 single-family units located on the south side of Shepard Road, north of Florida Avenue, east of Boat Lake, near the City's boundary on U.S. 17-92. Approximately 125 of the 138 units have been constructed or permitted. Project is nearing completion.





Southern Oaks Subdivision:

•The Southern Oaks subdivision consists of a 50acre development, with approximately 92 houses near the Oviedo and Winter Springs boundary along SR 434. Staff anticipates the scheduling of a pre-construction meeting in the near future.

Vistawilla Assisted Living Facility:

• On February 22, 2016, the City Commission approved the Preliminary/Final Engineering Plan and Aesthetic Review for a 77,207 square foot Assisted Living Facility, located on the south side of SR 434, west of the SR 434/SR 417 interchange, and adjacent to the eastern side of the Vistawilla office building. Building plans have been submitted. A construction date is scheduled for Fall 2016.
