# Mayor Lacey and Commissioner Greenberg Recognize Local Young 5K Runner and Philanthropist



Zechariah Cartledge is a local nine-yearold Layer Elementary student, runner, and philanthropist. Since he was a first-grader, Zechariah has been racing and growing his endurance from half-mile races to running in more than twenty 5k (3.1 miles) race, a sevenmile race, and a half marathon (13.1 miles). His love for running and competing sparked a new passion to run for a good cause and help others. "If you want to run in a 5K, definitely run for a good cause – and have fun. Even if you finish by walking, don't feel bad. Feel proud of yourself. It's better than quitting" says Zechariah.

In October 2017, ran in a local "Tunnel to Towers 5K Run & Walk" which honors 9/11 firefighter, Stephen Siller who died trying to help others on that fateful day and aims to raise money for families affected by 9/11. As part of his participation, Zechariah found his passion to help others.

Zechariah's determination & kind-heartedness has led him to raise over \$10,000 for the Tunnel to Towers Foundation as well as funds for his family and himself to travel to New York City to run in the "Tunnel to Towers 5K Run & Walk" on September 30.

On Thursday, July 26, Mayor Lacey, Commissioner Greenberg, and Police Chief Brunelle recognized Zechariah Cartledge on behalf of the City of Winter Springs and proclaimed "that we recognize this incredible nine-year-old Winter Springs resident . . . and to 'follow his lead' and do what you can do to support his causes, and whenever you can, to also try to go above and beyond to help others and make a difference like Zechariah Cartledge does – and, as the valiant Firefighter Stephen Siller's parents instilled in their children."



#### **2018 WINTER SPRINGS ELECTION**

The City of Winter Springs will hold a Municipal Election on **Tuesday, November 6, 2018** for the purpose of Electing a Mayor, and a Commissioner for District Two and District Four, all for a four (4) year Term of Office; and additionally, a Commissioner for District Three to serve the remaining two (2) years of what is normally a four (4) year Term of Office. (In November 2020, the District Three Commission Seat would continue to be a four (4) year Term of Office.)

Qualifying to run for any of these seats begins at noon on Monday, August 27, 2018 and ends at noon on Friday, August 31, 2018. Qualifying packets will be available around mid-August (2018) and will be available by contacting the *City Clerk at (407) 327-5955*.

# POLICE REPORT

#### **SUMMER HEAT**

#### **DRINK PLENTY OF WATER**

When checking the temperature outside, be sure to check the heat index as well! Don't let yourself get dehydrated, keep liquid on you as often as possible. According to the Mayo Clinic, adults should drink eight 8-ounce glasses of water a day. If you are exerting yourself outdoors, be sure to drink more than the recommended amount. Our bodies are nearly 60% water and need it to survive! Dehydration can lead to heat exhaustion or a heat stroke, so be careful. If you feel dizzy, disoriented, or have stopped sweating, get out of the heat immediately and contact a physician.

#### **HOT CARS**

Even during cool weather the inside temperature of our vehicles can rise quickly. The sun's wavelengths pass through the glass created the greenhouse effect and entrapping heat. This causes the temperature in your vehicle to rapidly increase at shocking rates. This is why we should NEVER leave a child or pet in an enclosed car. Even leaving the window or windows down, the vehicle still retains and can barely circulate heat. A hot vehicle can become a worst-possible scenario. If you encounter a child or pet left in a vehicle, contact the police immediately.

#### **AUGUST SAFETY TIP**

#### **HURRICANE KITS**

It is important to create a kit of supplies you could take with you if you are forced to evacuate. This kit will also be useful if you are able to stay in your home, but are still affected by the storm, such as through the loss of power. One common trend seen when hurricanes are approaching is a wide-spread panic. When this happens, people rush in large numbers to get all the supplies they think they need. However, if you prepare your kit ahead of time, you can alleviate a lot of the potential stress of a very chaotic situation. You should create your kit in a bag or tote you can easily take with you. Some recommended items to include are:

- Non-perishable food (enough to last at least 3 days)
- Water (enough to last at least 3 days)
- First-aid kit (include any prescription medication you may need)
- Personal hygiene items and sanitation items
- Flashlights (have extra batteries on hand)
- Battery operated radio (again, have extra batteries)
- Waterproof container with cash and important documents
- Manual can opener
- · Lighter or matches
- Books, magazines, games for recreation
- Special needs items: pet supplies and baby supplies if applicable
- Cooler and ice packs
- A plan for evacuation and if family members are separated



#### YOU LIVE IN BEAR COUNTRY

**BLACK BEARS** are an important part of Florida's natural heritage. Keeping bears wild and away from human use areas is a responsibility we all must share. FWC is dedicated to reducing conflicts between people and bears in your community.



Black bears are naturally shy, timid animals that try to avoid people. However, as human development expands, it becomes increasingly difficult for bears to avoid people.

# WHY ARE BEARS IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD?

Bears are lured into neighborhoods when they find an easily accessible food source. Bears that become used to getting human foods may damage property or become a threat to public safety. Common items that attract bears into neighborhoods include:

- Garbage
- Food smells from barbecue grills, coolers, and outdoor freezers/ refrigerators
- Animal feed (e.g., pet food, corn, grain, seed, bird seed, livestock feed)
- Gardens, compost piles, small or medium livestock (e.g., chickens, goats, pigs, rabbits)

Feeding bears, either by direct handouts or by leaving attractants such as garbage and pet food unsecured, causes bear conflicts and is against the law.

# IF YOU SEE A BEAR IN YOUR COMMUNITY...

Remain calm and stay away from the bear. The mere presence of a black bear does not represent a problem. The bear is most likely just passing through and will not linger or return if it does not find a reward such as food. A bear may climb a tree to look for food or if it gets scared. Clear the area of people and pets and allow the bear to come down when it feels safe (usually after dark). The bear found its way into the area and it can find its way out.

# IF YOU ENCOUNTER A BEAR AT CLOSE RANGE...

- DO NOT play dead or run from the hear
- Back away slowly with your arm raised
- Avoid direct eye contact
- Speak in a calm and assetive voice

### WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT A BEAR NEAR YOUR HOME?

The best way to avoid conflicts with bears is to secure anything that might attract a curious bear. The following suggestions may prevent bears from being attracted to and lingering in your neighborhood.

- Store your trashcan in a secure area, such as a sturdy shed or garage, and put it out on the MORNING of
- garbage pickup, NOT the night before.
- Get a commercially-manufactured bear-resistant trashcan that has been reinforced
- with metal and a push-to-open latching system.
- If you do not have trash service, you can buy bear-resistant trashcans from several online retailers,

- including Ace Hardware, Lowe's, and Home Depot.
- If you have trash service, ask for a bear-resistant trashcan. If they will not provide them, call your local government official. Enough citizens have taken action in some counties that they now have bearresistant trashcans.
- Build a small shed to store your trashcans. Important elements are to leave no gaps along edges and use screws instead of nails.\* Call your waste service provider to ensure they will service trashcans from a shed.
- Attach hardware to your regular trashcan to make it more bearresistant.\* For a 'retrofit' to be successful, the lid must not be flexible, and the can should not collapse when you stand on its side. Call your waste service provider for permission to 'retrofit' your trashcan.
