

REDUCE CHANCES OF CRIME

AT HOME

Take these simple precautionary measures to make entry so difficult that a burglar will look elsewhere for an easier target.

1. Lock your doors and windows!

- 2. Remove or trim shrubbery and trim trees for a clear view of entrances and windows.
- 3. Your home and garage service door should be well-lit. Inexpensive timers or an electrical photocell will turn lights on at dusk and turn them off at dawn. Motion activated spotlights can be an effective crime prevention device.
- 4. Always make your home appear occupied when you are not home, out for the evening, or on an extended vacation. Leave a radio or TV playing.
- 5. Never leave spare keys under doormats, in mailboxes, or over the door frame.
- 6. Make arrangements with a neighbor to pick up your newspapers, flyers, and mail.
- 7. Contact the Winter Springs Police Department to complete a house check form.
- 8. Don't keep large sums of money in the home. Mark your valuables with your Social Security Number, record serial numbers, take photographs and make an inventory of your items. A second copy should be kept in a secure location outside the home.
- 9. NEVER post your travel plans on social media!
