





FIREWORKS

The WSPD wishes everyone a happy Independence Day! The Fourth of July is a day that fills our stomachs with hotdogs and our hearts with red, white, and blue pride. As we celebrate, please keep the following in mind:

Over the years, fireworks in neighborhoods have increasingly become more dangerous. In 2016, fireworks caused four deaths and 11,100 injuries nationwide. In addition, fireworks start an average of 18,500 fires per year. These fires caused an average of three deaths, 40 injuries, and an average of \$43 million in direct property damage. In result, the WSPD is very proactive in its enforcement of State Laws and City Ordinances listed below. Any and all illegal fireworks are subject to confiscation and fines levied.

Florida Statute 791.02 (1) states it is unlawful for any person to use or explode any fireworks as defined in Florida Statute 791.01. Illegal fireworks are subject to confiscation under Florida Statute 791.05.

Winter Springs City Ordinance Sec. 7-27 states "no person(s) shall discharge, detonate, or allow the discharge or detonation of any illegal fireworks, as defined by Section 791-01 Florida Statutes, dynamite or any other explosive at any time within the city limits without the express permission of both the fire and police departments."

DON'T DRINK & DRIVE
