WHAT IS THE ONE CENT “PENNY” INFRASTRUCTURE SALES TAX?

On May 20, 2014, Seminole County voters approved the 3rd generation of the One Cent Infrastructure Sales Tax. Known as the Penny Sales Tax, collections are levied on the sale of consumer goods to visitors, residents, and businesses, ensuring the cost to construct and maintain infrastructure is shared.



TYPES OF PROJECTS FUNDED BY THE PENNY SALES TAX

Bridge Improvements, Land Acquisition, Parking Expansion, Roadway Resurfacing, Safety Vehicles, Stormwater and Drainage, Improvements, Traffic Signals and Turn Lanes, and Water Quality Projects.



FUTURE PROJECTS

The City of Winter Springs has earmarked \$5.5 million specifically for stormwater rehabilitation City wide. Work is expected to begin in 2024.

COMPLETED

Central Winds Trailhead - \$479,637.00

Constructed new restrooms and expanded the parking lot at the Central Winds Park Trailhead.

PROJECT	AMOUNT SPENT	SUMMARY
Land Acquisition	\$720,363	Purchased two parcels of land for future park expansion one just west of Central Winds Park the other at Torcaso Park allowed for the construction of new bathroom facilities.
Winter Springs Town Center Improvements	\$475,000	Enhanced and expanded parking in Winter Springs Town Center .
Road Resurfacing and Safety Improvements	\$3,838,924	Completed several safety enhancements along Winter Springs Boulevard in addition to several roadway resurfacing projects with more still to come. Roads resurfaced include: Shepard Road, Hayes Road, Benchwood Drive, Quail Nest Drive, O'Day Drive, Lamoka Court, Oswego Court, Olean Court, Northern Way, Winter Springs Boulevard
Bridge Improvements	\$611,957	In 2015 \$18,730 helped fund a study to determine which bridges would possibly need repairs in the future. After Hurricane Ian it helped fund improvements to the bridge approaches at Howell Creek. An additional \$2.5 million has been alloted for future projects.
Safety and Utility Vehicles	\$2,884,000	Purchased 16 new vehicles for police department and equipment for Utilities department.
Winter Springs Utilities	\$2,000,000	Funded critical capitol improvements to Water treatment plant and waste water treatment facility to improve performance and extend their useful life.
