


The **Police Duty Medal** is awarded to any sworn member who performs an act of outstanding police service which distinguishes the member beyond the routine call of duty.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE



PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS UNIT

The Professional Standards Unit helps maintain the trust of our community by assisting the staff with monitoring professional accountability and compliance by our members to state law, departmental policies, and our agency's core values. This trust is critical to the success of our police department and is a vital tool used to fight crime and reduce fear in the community. The Internal Affairs Unit thoroughly investigates complaints of officer misconduct, reviews policy and procedures, and the proper use of defensive action by our personnel.

USE OF DEFENSIVE ACTION SUMMARY

During 2023, officers found themselves in 22 situations that required them to respond with defensive action. These cases are all thoroughly reviewed, and all instances were found to be in compliance with department policies.






NATIONAL INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING SYSTEM

National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS)

Implemented to improve the quality of crime data collected by law enforcement, NIBRS captures details on each single crime incident and on separate offenses within the same incident, including information on victims, known offenders, relationships between victims and offenders, arrestees, and property involved in crimes.



A note from the Chief



This year, we saw three major issues impacting our crime rate—theft, fraud,

and drugs. These continue to be of concern as they impact the quality of our lives.

I can not stress enough the importance of reporting suspicious behavior to the police department. Social media is not the venue to ponder whether or not to report. Did you know that over 60% of this years car burglaries occurred with unlocked vehicles. If you locked your vehicle, 56 victims would likely not be a victim of a crime.

Fraud cases are on the rise nationwide. Criminals have become very clever in finding ways to get you to send them money. We are seeing more and more cases of people losing their savings because they thought a family member was in trouble. Please second guess who you are talking to. If you think something is off, then likely it is. Do not hesitate to call us. One of the number one reasons people do not call us is that they feel they bother us. Trust me when I say you are not!

Finally, drug cases. We are arresting more and more people for illicit and nonprescribed drugs. Many think drug use is a victimless crime. I can tell you it is not. We all become victims. Too many families have been torn apart by addiction. Help is available. Call us before it is too late. Overdoses are occurring at alarming rates. These can be prevented.

OPERATIONS BUREAU

The Operations Bureau of the Police Department has several components encompassing the Patrol Division, Operations Support Division, and Community Relations Division.

PATROL DIVISION

The Patrol Division personnel are deployed strategically to cover all six zones within the city. We aim to exceed our citizens' expectations and provide the highest quality law enforcement on every call. The primary responsibilities are to respond to emergency and non-emergency calls for service. In addition to responding to dispatch calls for service, officers conduct self-initiated activities such as traffic stops and patrolling neighborhoods to which they are assigned.

The professional men and women of the Winter Springs Police Department's Patrol Division do not limit their duties to crime prevention and traffic enforcement: officers routinely work with the community to help solve problems and maintain the peace. They also serve as first responders to medical emergencies, aiding sick or injured persons. Patrol Officers strive to build partnerships with those we serve.


OPERATIONS SUPPORT DIVISION

The Operations Support Division comprises Reserve Officers, the Traffic Enforcement Division, the Community Relations Division, and our civilian volunteer programs, including the Citizens On Patrol, Volunteers In Policing, and Chaplain programs. 
COMMUNITY RELATIONS DIVISION

The Community Relations Division is responsible for initiatives designed to help promote and foster relationships with our community. During the year, they participate in several events, including our Citizens Police Academy, Coffee with a Cop, HOA meetings, community involvement programs, and special events.

Community Relations personnel also manage the Explorer Post #708 program to engage young adults in activities that promote their law enforcement interests; the Shield 360 program that encompasses many of the crime prevention programs we offer to our residential and business community; and our Citizen's Advisory Committee that meets monthly to discuss ideas, problems, and solutions to keep our community strong.

LOCK IT OR LOSE IT




- -> Always keep your valuables out of sight or in the trun
- Never leave valuables in unattended vehicles
- Always LOCK your vehicle
- ➔ Notify law enforcement of any suspicious activity

Over half of the events involved unlocked doors or car drivers who left valuables in plain view without locking their doors. Many of these crimes can be prevented with some simple, common sense actions on our part.

Here are a few crime prevention tips to help keep us from becoming the victim of a burglary or theft:

- Always secure your car doors when parking your vehicle, even for just a few minutes. It takes just a matter of seconds to enter an unsecured vehicle.
- Do not leave valuables, such as purses, cell phones, portable radios, packages, etc., in plain view inside your vehicle. Secure them in a glove box, center console, or trunk. Thieves will search other vehicles that are easier targets if they do not see anything of value in your car.
- Park in well lighted areas at night. Light is an enemy of thieves.
- Be suspicious of anyone approaching your vehicle or roaming your neighborhood.



A significant percentage of all car crashes occur at intersections. There are a variety of reasons why. Distracted driving (i.e., drivers not noticing their light has turned red), aggressive driving (i.e., drivers running red lights), and inattentive driving (i.e., turning in front of oncoming traffic without looking) are all common factors —and these are just a few of numerous examples.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS BUREAU

The Criminal Investigations Bureau is responsible for Crime Scene and Property and Evidence and conducting criminal investigations of crimes occurring within the jurisdiction of the City of Winter Springs. Investigators are trained to investigate a wide range of crimes, including homicide, robbery, assaults, sex crimes, domestic violence, theft, burglary, fraud, vandalism, juvenile offenses, motor vehicle theft, missing persons, and any other felonies and serious misdemeanor cases.

CRIME SCENE PROPERTY & EVIDENCE

Technical Services and Property & Evidence Divisions provide various in-house services, including laboratory processing of evidence, inventory, and control of the department's property and evidence storage room, crime scene processing, and evidence collection functions. These highly trained personnel are critical to the agency's mission and provide a level of service that ranks among the highest in the area.



ONE PILL CAN KILL

DEA Laboratory Testing Reveals that 7 out of 10 Fentanyl-Laced Fake Prescription Pills Now Contain a Potentially Lethal Dose of Fentanyl



In 2023, DEA seized more than 78.4 million fentanyl-laced fake pills and nearly 12,000 pounds of fentanyl powder. The 2023 seizures are equivalent to more than 388.8 million lethal doses of fentanyl.

OPERATION MEDICINE CABINET



A drug amnesty dropbox has been placed in the lobby of the Winter Springs Police Department, which will allow you to drop off any unwanted medications 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with no questions asked. This will provide an opportunity for the citizens to surrender expired, unwanted, or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications for proper destruction. These types of drugs are a potential risk to public health and safety and the police department is committed to the safe disposal of these drugs.
